

Gospel Of Matthew Bible Reading Plan Week 5 Review



This week we studied Matthew 9:14–10:25. The passage includes accounts of healings, Jesus' instructions to His disciples, their calling, and His warnings about the persecutions they would face. Let's review together

Matthew 9:14–3

- v.14 – What reason did Jesus give for why His disciples did not fast while He was with them?
- v.18 – What is remarkable about the person who approached Jesus regarding his daughter?
- v.20–22 – What did Jesus recognize in the woman who touched His robe?
- v.24 – Why did the people laugh at Jesus?
- vv.30–31 – Why do you think Jesus told the men not to tell anyone about their healing? Why do you think they shared the news anyway?
- v.34 – What did the Pharisees accuse Jesus of?
- v.38 – What did Jesus tell us to pray for? How might we be part of the answer to that prayer?

Matthew 10:1–25

- v.1 – What is the key statement about what the disciples were empowered to do?
- Without looking, can you name the twelve disciples?
- Why did Jesus send the disciples to the Jews first?

- vv.9–10 – Why do you think Jesus told the disciples not to take money, extra clothes, or supplies?
- If a town refused to accept their message, what were the disciples instructed to do?
- vv.16–25 – Why do you think Jesus was so direct about how people would respond to the disciples? His words could have been discouraging—how did He also encourage them in the midst of these warnings?
